Grafting

Learn about different types of grafting, how to choose and take scion wood, choosing a receptor site, how to make the graft and seal it properly. We'll spend time practicing inside, and then head outside to top work larger trees. Each attendee will receive two apple rootstocks and two pear rootstocks to bench graft and take home.



Several types of scion wood will be available, (including cider apple stock) or bring your own. SUMMER WORKSHOPS

Summer Pruning & Bud Grafting

Typically thought of as a winter-time chore, pruning fruit trees during summer can improve tree health by opening the canopy for circulation as well as helping fruit to ripen. It's also much more enjoyable than clinging to a ladder during a blustery winter day. WSU Snohomish County Extension is pleased to present two workshops on summer fruit tree care.



Summer Fruit Tree Pruning (10am-noon)

Topics covered include the basics of pruning with an emphasis on the techniques and goals of summer pruning. You'll learn what issues can be addressed or exacerbated, the physiology of a tree's response to mid-season pruning, along with what to look for when deciding to prune, or not to prune. Bring your gloves and pruners for hands-on practice. Dress for the weather.

Bud Grafting (1pm-3pm)

Grafting, also thought of as a dormant season activity, is also a task for the pleasant days of summer. Using tiny chips of bud stock is a simple and economical way to add variety to your orchard.

You'll learn about the different types of grafting, how to choose and take bud wood, choosing a receptor site, how to make the graft and seal it properly. Each attendee will receive a Victorinox grafting knife as part of the course fee. Bring your gloves for hands-on practice. Dress for the weather.
